FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL INFORMATION

First Day - The first day back for the 2018-19 school year is Tuesday, September 4. Each year on the first day of school students find out which homeroom and teacher they have. Our teachers take great care and planning in placing each child in the proper class. Some of the variables include: boy-girl ratios, special program groupings and education assistant time. Parents are asked to please refrain from requesting specific teachers or homerooms except for reasons of special education (i.e. learning or physical disabilities). On Tuesday, September 4, our staff will be in the rotunda with grade signs to help students find their new classrooms.

Parking - Parking will be an issue the first day of school. Our parking lot cannot accommodate all driving parents who may wish to park and walk their children into the school. Our visitor parking lot can only accommodate 25 vehicles. We would ask parents to please consider parking at SCA Secondary and enjoy the three minute walk to the elementary school if you are walking your child into the school. This will alleviate a great deal of possible frustration. The drop-off-loop is still in effect for parents dropping their children off and proceeding into their day. **No parking** in the drop-off-loop will be permitted.

Shuttle Bus Service

In an attempt to relieve some of the school parking pressures at our elementary school, we are once again providing a free shuttle bus service, before and after school, to and from our secondary school. Parents will drop off their children in the morning at the secondary school and pick them up at the secondary school from the shuttle in the afternoon.

If you signed your child(ren) up for the shuttle service for this year (completed at the end of the last school year), please refer to the confirmation letter sent via e-mail with the newsletter which outlines the details of the shuttle service including what time to drop off and pick up your children at the secondary school and when the service begins.

If you did not sign up your child(ren) for the shuttle service and would like to, please contact the school office.

We are encouraging any elementary families who have children in our secondary school and are currently picking them up by car, or any families who find the parking lot congested and would like a larger parking area to retrieve their child(ren) to consider using this service. Families considering using the shuttle service must agree to be committed to using the service daily both in the morning and in the afternoon.

NOTE: Students who are signed up for regular EIPS bussing should NOT sign up for the shuttle bus. Students on regular EIPS buses can get off their bus at secondary with a parental note (sent to the bus driver).

Stay Connected: Subscribe to our news

As of the 2018-19 school year, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is moving to a new service provider for sending phone and email notifications to families, School Messenger. Families won't notice much of a difference - all email subscriptions are being transferred so, there is no need to resubscribe.

If you're new to EIPS and want to start receiving Division news and updates, or just want to review your subscription information, visit www.eips.ca/contact/subscribe. Canada's Anti-Spam Legislation (CASL) requires the Division to have direct consent before engaging in electronic communication with its families. Only those who have subscribed to receive emails will get information about Division and school-related news, such as newsletters, information about upcoming events, parent and community engagement opportunities, important school-based updates and more.

NOTE: Even if you're not subscribed, you will continue to receive emails regarding emergency situations and financial matters. Those who received notifications about high school attendance will also continue to receive those messages.

PAY SCHOOL FEES ONLINE!

School fee information for the 2018-19 school year is expected to be posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal by mid September. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online using Visa, MasterCard or INTERAC Online—when available from your financial institution.

Don't forget to log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, athletic-team fees and more.

If circumstances exist where you are unable to pay your students fees you can apply to have fees waived by submitting an Application for a Waiver of Fees. The application deadline is December 15, 2018.

Student Information Correction Forms - Changes are Coming!

CROSS COUNTRY RUNNING CLUB 2018

ATTENTION: All students who are in Grades 3-6

Our Cross Country Running Club starts the first week of school (Thurs. Sept. 6, first recess). Parents watch for the bright pink info sheet coming home on Thursday. Practices are Mondays - Sept. 10, 17, 24, and Oct. 1 @ 3:15-4:30 pm (attendance is **not** mandatory but highly recommended) and mandatory practices are Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday first recess. If you like to run this is a club for you. You can compete in up to 7 races from September to the middle of October. Or just come out and run for exercise.

1. There are three Wednesday races at 4:45 pm (Sept. 12-Callingwood Park, Sept. 26-Millwoods Park & Oct. 3-Rundle Park (new location)) in Edmonton (busing provided). This is the Harriers Elementary School Cross Country series.
2. There are three Thursday races at 5:00 pm (Sept. 13, 20 & 27) behind Wes Hosford Elementary School/Glen Allen Recreation Centre here in Sherwood Park. No buses for these races will be provided; parents need to bring their athlete. This series includes up to junior high school and the racing begins with the older athletes down to the younger ones. This is the Sherwood Park Cross Country Series.
3. The last race is on the Saturday after Thanksgiving weekend (Oct. 13 - noon-3:00 - **no** busing provided) at Rundle Park. This is the Autumn XC Classic. Parents are encouraged (and needed) to participate on the Teacher/Parent team at this race. Let Mrs. Doupe know if you are interested.



Compete in as many or as few as you are able. If you cannot make all of the races you are encouraged to try to do one complete series (all Wed. or all Thurs. races). But whether you can complete a whole series or do some of both - just come and run!!

Quick Facts: EIPS buses are all equipped with video surveillance

Did you know each EIPS bus is equipped with video surveillance? The video surveillance and equipment helps:

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and
- deter from destructive acts.

On a regular basis, EIPS Student Transportation reviews the video recordings, in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIP)*. The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct, and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Important Reminders for Parents

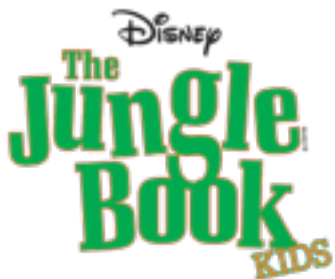
1. Please remember to check in at the Main Office before heading to any classroom. Mrs. Gagne or Mrs. Khajavi will call students to the office. We want to do everything we can to avoid any unnecessary interruptions to the classroom. There are lanyards and a sign-in book in the Main Office for all volunteers and visitors to the school.
2. We appreciate the continued support of our parents as we continue to maintain a modest dress code standard for our students. We would ask Grades 4 – 6 parents especially to review the dress code at the front of their child's agenda book.
3. Students should be seated in their desks when the "Warning Bell" rings at 8:39 am. **Classes begin at 8:40 am.** Students not in their desks at the 8:40 bell will be asked to pick up a late slip from the office and will be marked as "late". We ask parents and students to do your best to have students arrive on time so all classes can have a strong start to the day.

Improving Home-School Communication

To enhance communication between families and schools, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has developed a how-to guide entitled, "Communication Protocol for Schools". Topics include appropriate channels to use, standard formats and structures, timing and sequencing for regular and ongoing home-school communication, and ways to bring forward questions or concerns. Additionally, the manual offers useful tools and resources schools and families can use to enhance face-to-face meetings, emails and any social media efforts. School Supplies (Grade 1-3 Students)

In June, a letter was sent to all Grade 1-3 parents indicating that school supplies would be purchased by the school. This practice provides for continuity and ready access to supplies here at school. Parents are required to pay a fee to cover the cost of the supplies. This fee will be included in the school fees on Parent Portal.

Volunteers in Schools

The policy regarding volunteers requires that all volunteers annually sign a form including a declaration that they do not have a criminal record or child welfare record as well as agreeing to a confidentiality undertaking. Forms will be available at 'Meet the Teacher Night' or through the main office and we ask that if you are planning on volunteering at the school this year, that you complete the form and return it to your child's homeroom teacher. All visitors to the school must sign in at the office and wear an identification tag provided each time you volunteer. Thank you.

SCA Elementary staff and students will be practicing emergency response procedures in the event of an emergency. We will practice emergency evacuation, lockdown and shelter-in-place procedures throughout the 2018-19 school year.

FUNDRAISING FOR MISSIONS

This is the sixth year of our "Wheels in Motion" Missions Project. This project involves supporting an orphanage in Vicente Guerrero, Mexico. The monies go toward buying wheelchair and wheelchair parts, along with supporting a classroom of special needs students. Each SCA Elementary classroom completes one fundraiser each year in their class to support this cause. After School Supervision

Just a reminder to parents, after the final dismissal bell at the end of the day, children who are not bus students must be picked up or be on their way home within 10 minutes. After this time, we do not provide after school supervision.

Footwear

Students in K-6 are required to have separate footwear for use inside of the school. Please make note of the following:

1. Shoes left at school must be kept in the student's homeroom.
2. Shoes that mark or damage floors in any way are not to be worn.
3. A pair of **athletic running** shoes for PE are required (NOT skateboard, backless, platform or "roller" runners. Runners must be able to be tied tightly, support the foot and flex properly.) These shoes can be used as the indoor footwear.



Parents in Partnership



The mandate of Parents in Partnership is to pray in the schools for one hour each week and to support the staff and teachers in prayer. MEDICATIONS ADMINISTERED AT SCHOOL

As per our medication policy, if your child will be requiring medication to be kept in the office for the 2018-19 school year, or if they require medication to be administered to them while at school, a **Medication/Personal Care Request and Authorization** form (available in the office) must be filled out. Medication must be in the **original container, labeled with their name, dosage and times**. If it is prescription medication, the pharmacy label must be intact and the label must have an expiry date. If the label is not legible or is missing, or if there are medications mixed in the same bottle, the medication cannot be used. **We do not give out “stock” medication to students.** Thank you for your co-operation.



Nut AWARE School

We are proud to be a nut aware school. Because nuts can cause severe, life-threatening reactions in some of our students, we ask that you **do not send** food items that contain peanut butter/peanuts/all tree nuts and sesame seeds. ENHANCING LITERACY AND NUMERACY

As part of Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) ongoing efforts to enhance the literacy and numeracy of students in all grade levels, the Division is once again planning to administer the STAR 360 and Math Intervention/ Programming Instrument (MIPI) assessment tools in the 2018-19 school year. The tools focus on literacy and numeracy, are digitally based and offer an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning. The goal: to provide timely information to teachers, help enhance classroom instruction and ensure student learning needs are identified.

In September and May, EIPS students in grades 1 through 12 will complete the STAR 360 assessment, which evaluates reading comprehension. The assessment takes approximately 20 minutes and can be taken on any digital device. Also in September, students in grades 2 through 10 will complete the MIPI assessment, which is a mathematic screening tool used to inform teachers about a student's math skills. For students in grades 7 through 10, the MIPI takes approximately 50 minutes and for students in grades 2 through 6 it takes approximately 20 minutes. The results of each offers the teacher a clearer picture about a student's learning needs and helps determine if subsequent instructional planning is required.

The scores of the assessments are not used towards a student's grade and there is no need to study ahead of time. Both simply provide the teacher with information to better understand where each student is in terms of reading comprehension and mathematic ability. If, after analyzing the results, it's determined a student can benefit from extra support, the teacher will contact the family to discuss possible support strategies.
