## TRACK & FIELD DAY - FRIDAY, JUNE 7, 2024

We are praying for good weather for our Div I and Div II Track & Field Day on Friday, June 7!

**Div I** (grades 1-3) will be using our own school fields to spend the day participating in 15 events. Each of the 15 groups will be led around the course by a grade 3 group leader and assistant leader. It is always an enjoyable day by all. At the end of the day the students will gather together for a freezie and ribbon awards for first through third place. Mr. Alstad heads up this meet.

The Div II (grades 4-6) Track and Field Day will take place at the Strathcona Athletic Park (behind Bev Facey School). The students will be in groups of 16 and travel through 16 events. The activities range from regular Track and Field events such as high jump and 100m dash to irregular events such as sack races and dry land canoeing. At the end of the day every student will be awarded with a first to fourth place ribbon. Mr. Fung heads up this meet.

There will be a concession available at lunchtime for the Div II students: Hot Dogs, Chocolate Bars, Chips and Pop: \$2.00 each

#### Some reminders:

### GRADE 4-6 SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS FOR 2024-25

### **GRADE 1-3 SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

Parents of children entering grades 1-3 are reminded that you will pay a fee in late September for school supplies that will be purchased and provided by the school.

### **CLASS PLACEMENT**

Each fall, students find out which homeroom and teacher they have. Great care and planning occurs in placing each child in the proper class. Staff spend a great deal of time considering variables such as: individual needs, learning styles, peer groupings, social interactions, boy-girl ratios, special program grouping, educational assistant times, etc. before setting the lists.

Parents are asked to refrain from requesting specific teachers or homerooms, except for reasons of special education (i.e., learning or physical disabilities).

#### **Student Transportation: 2024-25 Registration**

Planning to use Student Transportation in the 2024-25 school year? If so, make sure your child is registered so Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) can plan routes and send your child a bus pass before the first day of school.

All students who indicated needing transportation' services through the returning student or new student registration processes are now registered. Those families have also received tentative route schedules and invoices—fees are due June 30, 2024.

For those students who did not indicate needing transportation services during the registration process and want to now register, contact EIPS' Student Transportation office at 780-417-8151.

NOTE: Families can pay fees online using the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. To pay in-person, visit the <u>EIPS</u> <u>Student Transportation building</u> during its office hours—Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on school days and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on non-school days.

### Shuttle Bus Service for 2024-2025

In an attempt to relieve some of the school parking pressures at our elementary school, we are once again providing a free shuttle bus service, before and after school, to and from our secondary school.

Parents will both drop off their children in the morning and pick them up in the afternoon at the secondary school.

We are encouraging any elementary families who have children in our secondary school and are currently picking them up by car, or any families who find the elementary parking lot congested and would like a larger parking area to retrieve their child(ren) to consider using this service. <u>Families</u> <u>using the shuttle service must agree to be committed to using the service daily, both in the morning</u> <u>and in the afternoon.</u>

To sign-up for the shuttle, please complete the online registration located <u>here</u>.

NOTE: Students who are signed up for regular EIPS busing should NOT sign up for the shuttle bus. Students on regular EIPS buses can get off their bus at secondary with a parental note (sent to the bus driver).

In March, the Division conducted the annual survey, which helps EIPS gauge its progress toward meeting the goals and priorities outlined in its <u>Four-Year Education Plan</u>. Families were asked a series of questions about their experiences with EIPS and the school their child attends, the overall performance of the Division, the quality of education being provided to students and areas for improvement.

Thank you to all families who took the time to share their feedback with the Division. Overall, the survey received close to 1,900 responses from parents and caregivers across EIPS. The Division, and schools, will now review the feedback in detail and use it to develop new strategies to serve students and the wider community better.

If you're moving this summer, you'll submit the necessary updates through the Student Information Update after you've moved at the start of next school year. The form is open—for current-year updates—until June 14 at noon. It will reopen for families at the start of next school year.
